Redevelopment of the Old Oak Common Site, Acton

This will become the largest regeneration and development site in Europe it crosses over three boroughs, Brent, Ealing and Hammersmith and Fulham:

- 25,000 new homes will be built
- 60,000 new jobs created
- the area will have a large new Crossrail station the size of Waterloo station North London and West London Citizens are drawing up a plan of action and campaign to target the people in power to make sure the voices of the community are heard.

Our focus is on the following:

- A good percentage of the new homes should be genuinely affordable
- That new jobs should benefit local people
- That the area should be a London Living wage zone

Marcia Jacks and Floyd Vassell are the Church representatives on North London Citizens and will be organising a Listening Campaign where we want to hear your views and your stories or your families around housing and jobs. We hope to organse this for October/ early November. The date will be announced in the Come Alive.

As a people we want to be engaged in our community and even though some of us may be well housed and have good jobs, let us remember those who are struggling in these areas and join the campaign to make their lives better.

Interview with Sister Hermine (Dolly) Hall

This quarter we have the pleasure of interviewing Sis Hermine Hall who has been at Willesden for 22 years, I don't think there is a time I have gone to church and not seen Sis Hall, she is a faithful member. We asked her how she has coped during the pandemic.

What changes have you seen in this time?

Because of the pandemic the numbers have decreased and many people have stopped coming.

How have you managed in the pandemic?

I have coped fairly well throughout the pandemic and having a family to support me throughout the journey helped tremendously.

Are there any negatives or positives from the pandemic you would like to share?

The pandemic caused a lot of separation between families we can't visit each other, plenty people don't want to travel because it's a lot to go through they make it very difficult for people and I know of a lot of people who got left behind in Jamaica they didn't board the plane because they didn't have one form filled in properly.

What is your favourite book of the bible or your favourite scripture?

My favourite scripture is Psalm 91.

- 1 He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.
- 2 I will say of the LORD, He is my refuge and my fortress: My God; in him will I trust.

Have you got a favourite hymn, if yes what is it and why is it special to you?

What advice do you have for younger women who may be struggling with their faith at this time?

To hold on to Jesus who is the Author and finisher of their faith.

Interview with Dr Charlotte Johnson

Congratulations Charlotte on receiving your Doctor of Ministry degree (Dmin).

Thank you. I give God all the honour in gaining this qualification.

Can you tell us why you choose to do a Dmin?

It started when I wanted to learn more about Pastoral Care because I became passionate about serving others, and wanted to gain a better understanding about Pastoral Care, so I attended a weekend course at the Leadership Training Centre at the NTCG's headquarters in Northampton. A few months later I was invited to join an inaugural cohort of NTCG students to embark on a Masters' programme at the Pentecostal Theological Seminary (PTS). Once I completed that qualification, I went on to commence the Doctor of Ministry programme which I completed in April, and I graduated in May 2021.

How long did it take you?

In total it took seven years; the time went by quickly.

What is the title of your Dmin?
The title is "An exploration of bereavement experiences supported by pastoral care leadership in a Pentecostal setting in the Church of God in the United Kingdom." I focused my research on the brethren attending churches within the Willesden District.

Can you give some background on the topic?

Although I am British born, my parents were Jamaican. I absolutely love my Jamaican heritage. I am intrigued by the traditions, symbolisms, and practices that the Windrush Generation brought with them. A few years ago I began to notice that there were an increasing number of our Windrush Generation brethren transitioning from life on earth to eternity, consequently bereavement and funerals became part of church life. I observed that the church community were very supportive in the initial stages of bereavement. Also, I noticed that some people, especially adult children who lost their parent(s), struggled to readjust following the death of their loved one(s). Bereavement, grief and loss are part of the human cycle and condition, yet the process can be complex. My curiosity led to wanting to better understand what was available regarding longer term support for the bereaved brethren and their families. Death, grief, and loss are found throughout the Old and New Testament books of the bible, but as COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted, bereavement is not a traditionally well

understood or 'talked about topic', even in the church. However, generally speaking, as a culture of people from the Caribbean, death is celebrated through its traditional practices, particularly by the more senior Windrush Generation.

What are the positive highlights of the process that you would like to share?

I believe I have grown immensely throughout the process. The journey has been character building, especially as a child of God. My desire to serve people through serving God has grown much stronger over the years, hence I am actively working within and outside the church walls. Over the past few years my passion has translated into establishing my ministry as a Pastoral Care Practitioner. For example, at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Pastoral Reaching Out (PRO) Ministry was birthed to support the congregation, particularly the elderly and vulnerable members. I do not believe I would have set up the PRO Ministry in the manner and speed in which I did without the experience of studying a postgraduate qualification, so I give God thanks for the vision, stamina, and confidence to start the ministry under the leadership of the Pastors. I wrote a case-study about the PRO Ministry which was published in the Association of Christian Counsellors' journal, the Accord in the summer of 2020.

You must have had some stress - do you want to tell us about any and how you overcame them?

I often declare that I don't do stress, so I work very hard at minimising stresses in my life wherever possible. Of course, there are times in your life when trouble will find you and grab your attention. This happened to me within months of starting the Masters programme. On at least three separate occasions in the first two years of study I came very close to giving up studying. However, the God I serve had other plans and so even when I doubted and thought it was impossible to continue, my God brought me through. When I reflect on my journey, there were signs that I was in a spiritual battle throughout the life of both qualifications, but look at what the Lord has done!! This is why my accomplishment is so precious, because I recognise I would not have become a Doctor of Ministry without God being on my side at every step of the way.

Do you have a favourite scripture or song that sustained you throughout the tough times?

I do have a few Scriptures because there were multiple

challenges in terms of my secular work, family life, and trying to keep on top of the many assignments during my studies. If I have to choose a Scripture it would be Psalms 121 undergirded by Psalm 23. My song would be "Praise Is What I Do" song by William Murphy. apart from the tune, I found meditating on the words effective, for example, "I'll praise You through the good and the bad... Cause I owe it all to You." Truly powerful words that gave me the strength to lift my faith and continue one step at a time, one day at a time, one assignment at a time.

What are your plans now that you have completed your PhD?

I am focussed on serving God through his people, so I am available to my church community through offering pastoral care. Plus, I am planning to continue the research in the area of bereavement starting in October. This time I will be concentrating on my church community at Willesden specifically, looking at the impact of COVID-19 pandemic on the Windrush Generation and their descendants. This is likely to take three years, so I covet the prayers and support of my church family who I have a lot of love for.




